As the sponsoring guild of the OHS conference, we need to provide a good number and variety of finished projects for exhibition. Please bring your projects to the April meeting. They will be displayed at our guild's table during the conference and returned to you when the conference is over. (This is over and above the juried competition, which has the theme "Optical Illusions".)

We haven't had much participation yet in the Weaver's Challenge. Participation could be fun and educational, and the result could be displayed at the OHS conference. We have relaxed the requirements somewhat. You can make a table runner, shawl, scarf, placemats, tea towels, or a similar item. It must be based on a modified old draft. A good source is *A Handweaver's Pattern Book* by Marguerite P. Davison (we have several reference copies in the studio library). Take a draft from that book, make a slight modification to it, and produce one of the items listed above. That's it!

We need a writer and a photographer to produce a feature article for Fibre Focus about the OHS conference. If you are going to be attending the conference and would be interested in one (or both) of these jobs, please let me know. Perhaps the writer could interview people at the conference to get some different perspectives on what is happening.

Also, in the future we would like to have someone write up regular contributions to "Regional and Guild News" in *Fibre Focus* and to the e-news of the Council for the Arts in Ottawa. Let me know if you would be interested in taking this on.

The OVWSG has been given an additional storage room in the new building. We now have a large room for our studio as well as two smaller storage rooms. Guild Exhibition and Sale

Planning meeting Saturday, February 9th 10.00-12:00 in the Community Room (red doors, lower level) at Heartwood House.

First of all I would like to thank everyone who volunteered at last year's event. We tried some new things (sale survey, brochure and booth layout) and this could not have happened without the help of many, in particular Linda Tait and Shirley Osprey. Much thanks to Francesca Overend and Jean Sharp who looked after the registration and advertising respectively. I would also like to thank Louise Leberge, and her army of volunteers, who staffed the guild booths and helped with set up and take down. Lastly, a general thank you to all others who worked behind the scenes to make this event successful! It really shows how much effort and energy it takes to make this happen each year!

As announced at the January Guild meeting, there has been a substantial increase in the cost of renting the Glebe Community Centre space (from approximately \$1,000 in 2012 to \$3,000 in 2014). The Guild executive has agreed to offset much of this increase by paying for the booth spaces that it will be using. Nonetheless, it will mean increases in vendor costs and possibly a restructuring of the fees generally. One decision that has been made is to convert the guild exhibition area into two extra booths, one of which may be used for a workshop display.

At this time the required increases could be applied as a set price per square foot, or as a 20% increase over last

year's fees. In the former scenario small booths (80 sq feet) would be \$144 and large booths (120 sq ft) would be \$216, in the latter case small booths would be \$150

be \$216, in the latter case small booths would be \$150 and large booths \$210. In either case these are very low rates for space at a show in central Ottawa during craft show season, so we do not anticipate having empty booths. These alternatives and possible layouts for the hall will be presented and discussed at the meeting on Feb 9th. Please come and contribute your thoughts to this discussion, bring your ideas to establish a theme and make a commitment to help make the 2013 event successful.

The vendor's application form will reflect the final decision on fees and layout and will be distributed with the March Newsletter. It will also be sent to individuals who have expressed an interest in joining our event, but who are not yet guild members. As usual, your previous location will be reserved for you for one month, after which it will be released to new vendors if no application form and money have been received. We would remind you that partnering with others is an alternative that has proved to be successful for many guild members.

Local Lacemakers Invite you to Their 25th Lace Day

The Ottawa Guild of Lacemakers is holding its 25th annual Lace Day at the RA Center, Clark Room, 2451 Riverside Drive, Ottawa, Ontario, on April 7th, 2013 from noon to 4 pm. Entrance fee is \$3.00 for adults and free for children under 12.

Guild members will display some of their work, and experienced lacemakers will be on hand to identify heirloom and antique lace. Vendors from Canada and the US will sell merchandise for bobbin lace, tatting and needle lace enthusiasts. Lacemakers will also demonstrate the techniques of bobbin lacemaking. This family event will be a great opportunity to learn this art of lacemaking as children and adults will be able to try their hand at the art of bobbin lace.

Every year the Guild challenges its members to create something according to a defined theme. This year's theme is Silver. You will be able to view this exhibition along with other lace articles done by members of the guild. Visitors will be able to vote on the theme competition

The Ottawa Guild of Lacemakers, comprised of lacemakers from the Ottawa and surrounding areas including the Outaouais is a non profit organization whose purpose is to promote the art of bobbin lace and other types of lacemaking. While we are interested in all forms of lace, our main concentration is on bobbin lace. The Guild promotes the exchange of ideas and techniques among its members, offers workshops by local and foreign teachers, and maintains a small library. The Guild meets on the second Thursday of the month at 6:30 pm and on the third Saturday for a day of lacemaking at the Trille des Bois School, located at 140 Genest Street, Ottawa. 1. Welcome	 Aurora welcomed all and asked if there were any new members or visitors. New members joining us this evening were Patty, a spinner; Ride, a felter; and Wanda Allard is a returning member who enjoys weaving, dyeing, felting, basketry & finger weaving. 	
1.1 2013 Project Plans	 A few members shared, as requested by Aurora, their 2013 Project Plans: Stephanie plans to spin one new fibre each month, half with rare breed fibres; and, to spin and knit a sweater Nancy is going to weave and sew a kilt Patty plans to dye her handspun and knit her first sweater Jan will be taking an on-line class on making felted boots Pauline is going to make something on her loom Janet is half way through her Weaving Challenge project weaving blue cloth that will become curtains. Items are wanted for the guild display at the OHS Conference in May – any of these projects would be great to display! 	
1.2 Grant Report	 The interim grant report is due to the city and Mandy is working on this. Reports and information requested of others must get to Mandy by next week 	
1.3 Outaouais Guild Members	 Mandy informed us – and specifically member of the former Outaouais Guild – that the miniature house project donated many years ago to the Almonte Museum for Textiles, may be returning to us. Members made the house and the furnishings. Due to limited space it was donated to the Museum. The Museum has contacted Mandy since they do not want it any longer. OVWSG space remains limited however it would be interesting to take back and document the project with photos and text. The condition needs to be checked. There are things missing. There is great potential to write and publish a story about the project. Members – present OVWSG and former Outaouais members – agreed to take back the house. 	
1.4 Weaver's Challenge	 Mandy acknowledged that there is hesitation to participate in the Weaver's Challenge due to the requirement to produce yardage. Therefore, an alternative is proposed, that any item can be made. The project must remain based on an old draft, which can be modified. 	
1.5 The Move	 Final plans for renovation of the new space are currently with the city and all is expected to be okay and renovations will begin. OVWSG has been given an additional storage space of approximately 645 square feet. 	

1.6 Resource Studio	 Ann Sunahara reported that there is usually one request per month of someone selling weaving equipment. Ann is compiling a list. If there is something you are in need of, let Ann know by emailing <u>studiomanager@ovwsg.com</u> A small 8-harness loom will be added to the guild equipment The 45-inch, 4-harness Clement loom will soon be up for sale
1.7 OHS Conference	 We are the sponsoring guild of the Ontario Handweavers and Spinners biennial conference scheduled for May 1 to 5, 2013. See Fibre Focus magazine and the OHS web site for registration forms. The early bird deadline is January 20th at \$495 for the entire package of workshops, 3 night stay, all meals, banquet and fabulous location.
1.8 Workshops	 A second Kumihimo workshop has been added and there are only a few spots left. Contact Elizabeth as soon as possible. Email Elizabeth if interested in a course and then immediately send in registration and payment. Spots are held for a short period of time to await arrival of payment, but cannot be held indefinitely.
1.9 Library	 Mary reminded all to look around at home for wandering and misplaced books. Recently 2 books borrowed in 2005 were found wandering in a member's home and returned. Thank you!
1.10 Donation	 Donna recently bought some equipment and would like to make a donation to the guild in memory of the vendor. At this time the guild is in the process of applying for charitable status. Until then the guild is not able to issue receipts for donations. However a donation to the library will immediately benefit all members.
1.11 Exhibition & Sale	 Ann Middleton, Exhibition & Sale Co-ordinator, provided an update on recent issues: Due to changes at the city we no longer qualify for a discount on space rental at the Glebe Community Centre. The increase amounts to almost double the cost and that cost will be downloaded to vendors. The guild can offset some of the increase by paying for spaces used by guild. There was discussion regarding dropping the 'exhibition' portion of the event and turning the guild exhibit space into more vendor space. The last few years there was no one to co-ordinate the exhibit portion of the event. There are more vendors that want to come than we have had space for in the past. A vendors meeting will be held in the near future. Exact costs not yet known. Space is reserved for next year. Demonstrations can still occur and items can still be exhibited but in different ways.
