Resource Centre News

Resource Centre Classroom MOVED

The classroom part of the Resource Centre was moved down the hall (second door on right), over the March break. The library stays where it is. The new room provides west windows facing Chapel St. which can be opened for air and there has been no history of flooding in the new room. The room is in a sort of T shape, with the looms along the top of the T. The class area is along the body of the T, facing the windows. There is a storage room for our yarns and equipment cabinets. There was also talk of taking a storage room across the hall to store all the table looms. The doors have been keyed so that the original key that opens the RC door also opens the other doors.

The sewing group is now in our old classroom area. However, since they do not use the space on evenings and weekends, Moe (HH Exec. Director) has suggested that we could still use this area by moving the sewing machines aside. That means we can still socialize outside the library on meeting nights and perhaps have 2 workshops running on a particular day or the old classroom could be a meeting place for members, even though a workshop is running in the new classroom.

The good news is that our rent will drop by \$30/month. There was no cost incurred by the guild for the move. Heartwood House paid for all the renovations and did all the moving of equipment. Special thanks go out to the members who kept on top of the renovation progress and advised on the new room layouts.

The Patricia Harris Gallery of Textiles & Costume presents highlights from the ROM's renowned collection of over 50,000 textile and costume artifacts, in a display of approximately 200 pieces dating from the 1st millennium BC to the 21st century AD. Outstanding examples include Chinese imperial costume, late Antique and early Islamic textiles from Egypt, western fashion from the Baroque period to the present day and early Canadian coverlets. These illustrate the extensive transformations in textile design and technology throughout the past three millennia.
