### 2009 International Back to Back Wool Challenge

A group of 7 spinners and knitters from the Ottawa, Larnark County and St. Lawrence Valley guilds known as the Wooly Wonders are competing as a team in the International *Back to Back* Wool Challenge where the objective is to shear a sheep, spin its yarn and knit a sweater in less than eight hours following strict rules and a set pattern. The Wooly Wonders will take a 3 minute penalty to accept previously sheared wool from the Carleton Co-Operative Wool Growers.

Upper Canada Village will be hosting this event on Sunday June 7<sup>th</sup> 2009 from 9 a.m to 5.p.m. Tickets on the finished sweater will be on sale for 99 cents each. Gertrude Thibeault will have tickets for sale at the May 4<sup>th</sup> meeting.

All the money raised from the sale of tickets will be given to the Lymphedema Association of Ontario, a debilitating fluid retention condition affecting both men and women which commonly occurs when the

lymph nodes are removed during cancer surgery. The team's goal is to raise \$1,000.

# Blogging from a Beginner's Perspective

On April the 4<sup>th</sup> I began my first blog on the instigation of Catherine Gutsche, a fine Ottawa artist and fellow Etsy shop designer. Blogs are websites where you report regularly on chosen topics. Daily reports are quite common. There is free access to your blog and people may sign up as "followers" to receive each updated blog report. My blog site,

http://johntoftbasketryatetsy.blogspot.com/, is a compilation of reports on basket-making. One of my first reports was about dyeing cane. The next was a two-week series that followed the step-bystep process of making a custom order basket for my across-the-street neighbour, Wanda. That series concluded with a picture of a satisfied customer and her basket.

Creating and maintaining a blog is time consuming. It is, however, one more tool in marketing. My blog has direct access to my etsy shop. I also have three of Catherine Gutsche's paintings on my site, with access from these to her etsy shop too. Cross marketing is useful too since Catherine has three of my baskets pictured on her blog.

If you are interested in my blog do visit it. You will see that my early blogs were technically unsure. A steep learning curve led to better looking blogs. If you are interested in creating your own blog, it is easy to do, and it is free. Go to my blog. At the top of the first page is "Create a blog." Click on that and follow the instructions. #### **DVD Review**

Jacey Boggs at www.insubordiknit.com has produced a fabulous instructional DVD entitled "Sit and Spin - The spinner's guide to creating smart, sturdy, outrageous Art Yarns" (art yarns are what we used to call "novelty yarns"). It is the best howto DVD I have ever seen on any topic. Jacey guides the viewer through 5 basic techniques, with variations on each. Each technique is shown at full speed and step by step. Looping excerpts are available to let you watch a particular technique in detail. As a bonus, each section is introduced by some really fun music courtesy of Jacey's husband and his band. Thanks to this DVD I now know the trick to producing "thick and thin" - who knew a flick of the wrist was all it took? Take note, however, this is not a beginner's DVD, it assumes at least the ability to produce an even, balanced yarn. That said, there were 3 of us watching it - an advanced beginner, an intermediate and an experienced spinner and we all learned something.
