Message from your President *Mandy Heggtveit*

September and October are usually one of our busiest months with the beginning of a new season and preparations for the Exhibition and Sale. This year is no exception and if anything it is even more intense than in past years. The Bonnie Inouye workshops are approaching with lightening speed and the 2011 – 2012 workshop schedule will be available very soon. The reason why I keep mentioning the Guild's education program is to emphasize that the OVWSG has the mandate to advance and promote knowledge of textile crafts in the region. The Guild is in fact the only organization in the National Capital Region that has the venue, capacity and knowledge base to fulfill this function.

I used the term 'textile crafts' earlier very deliberately in an effort to celebrate the fact that the spinning, weaving, felting, basket making or knitting crafts have their roots in longstanding traditions but are practiced today in a contemporary context and aesthetic. Generally speaking, I consider the fine crafts and the fine arts different yet parallel and equal practices. To illustrate this concept I like to draw comparisons with other art forms such as classical music and jazz or painting and photography. What ultimately matters is how good, or how not so good, we are within the context of our chosen practice and not be compared with the standards of a different milieu. What is important is being true to and having faith in oneself. It is the OVWSG's objective to raise the technical and aesthetic standards within its membership and the upcoming workshops and courses will help to achieve this goal. As soon as the new schedule is out I encourage everyone to look through it carefully, select the workshops or courses you feel will help you to become more proficient in your practice and widen your horizons. And mark the dates in your calendars. The raffle booklets are ready and will be distributed shortly. As I mentioned at the September meeting every member of this Guild is expected to sell one booklet (four 'three-ticket tickets' worth a total of \$20.each) between now and November 5th. The tickets will be ready for distribution at the October meeting and are expected to generate up to \$2,500 in total.

As announced in the last Newsletter, Bonnie Inouye will give a talk on "The Big Ida" at the meeting on October 3. This is a 2-hour presentation and for this reason there won't be a business meeting. Should anything of great urgency arise please let me know and I can send an email to the membership.

2. City Grant	 As stated in a recent email, the Guild has received a 3 year operating grant from the City. Annual reports will be due to the City by January 16th, so committee persons will be asked to submit their statistics for the City report. The increase in funding allowed for the recent renovations and changes in the Resource Centre (RC). In future we may be able to offer scholarships for those who cannot afford the cost of classes and workshops. 			
3. German visitors	Recently a delegation from Germany toured Heartwood House and included the equivalent of a provincial premier. Although the RC was not officially on their tour, they stopped by. They had many pertinent and precise questions. They were very interested in the RC, the guild, and Heartwood House. Their tour was videotaped.			
4. Raffle	 The Raffle is the primary fundraiser that takes coincides with the annual Exhibition and Sale. Funds are essential for our workshops.
