Message from your President

It is now almost two months since Kelly MacGregor lead us through the SWOT exercise to identify our Guild's strengths, weaknesses, opportunities and threats. Since then I had plenty of time to think about what **you** identified as being either positive or negative aspects of our Guild. I was impressed by the lively participation of everyone and the honesty of the opinions that were expressed throughout the exercise.

Going through Kelly's analysis of the evening I identified two weaknesses that I believe we have to address now: the perception of cliquishness amongst the membership and the lack of volunteer spirit. Let's start with cliquishness.

In my opinion, the perception of cliques is unavoidable in long-established organizations such as ours. The reality is that some members have been with the OVWSG for decades and in that time have formed strong and close friendships. What is avoidable, however, is for friends to isolate themselves during meetings and not making any efforts to include newer members in their conversations. On the other hand, it is not particularly helpful if new members sit in their chairs looking at the floor or knitting instead of approaching other members to find out more about them or the Guild. I realize that this is difficult for many and there are ways to get around this. For example, taking workshops and/or participating in other Guild activities are a great way to get to know other members. For me, weaving on the 100" loom with a number of Guild members I had previously not spoken with very often offered me an opportunity to get to know them better which was a personally rewarding experience.

Another means of integrating oneself into the fabric of any organization is, of course, to make a personal contribution – and this brings me to my second point, that of volunteering – or the lack thereof.

I sometimes have the impression that as soon as the term 'to volunteer' is articulated most individuals wish they could instantly evaporate in order not to be snared

into one or the other life threatening activity. Yes, volunteering requires giving up a bit of time but it has been my experience that most people considerably overestimate the time required of them. I won't go into the benefits of volunteering since I am sure that everyone is familiar with all its noble aspects. In terms of the OVWSG what volunteering requires is for us to contribute a small amount of our special talents, knowledge and time to the organization and should not be considered a sacrifice. Every one of us is really good at some things, not so good at others and consequently we prefer doing what we are good at; this should help us to identify where we are prepared direct our volunteering activities. And, as I mentioned earlier, by working for a while with the rest of the membership newcomers will quickly realize that what they perceived as impenetrable cliques are simply a number of friends talking to each other – and that they can be part of it.


