On day 1 you will be shown how to dye the chiffon silk base, while in day 2 you will get to work out how to make a pattern suitable for a felt jacket that reflects you. By day 3, you will be into the felting process with we hope additional time on Day 4 to do further embellishment to make the garment truly unique. This is the second class that we have offered that integrates the design process and pattern making, so we hope this will intrigue a number of you. Treasurer Report - Kathleen

- year-end report is almost finalized and will be ready for the June 3 meeting
- it's been a successful, busy year

Comments

- classes have been excellent for generating revenue
- members were encouraged to continue taking courses which aids guild eligibility for grants from the City of Ottawa
- need raffle sales to help generate revenue

Show and Sale - Ann

- advised members that she is putting together promotional material for the show and sale
- will have bookmarks ready for next month
- members can put items on the community table but must donate 10% of profits to the guild and must work at the table

Operations - Mandy

- has been contacting members to ask if they'd be interested in filling positions and asks that members reply whether or not they want a position
- there are still some positions to fill

Guild Move - Ann Sunahara

- moving date for Heartwood House will be on July 26th, but the guild moving date will hopefully be phased
- the library will be packed on July 22nd so that the studio can be used up until the moving date
- everything else will be moved after July 26th
- comments that Guild membership with Heartwood House is well worth the cost
- 3 members helped with the OC Transpo Sale which raised over \$5000
- the 45-inch loom is not being sold since only one offer (\$150) was received and it was decided to wait until after the move for a more reasonable one

- workshops are still running and there is room in all of them
- any new by request workshops will be put on hold until the fall

OHS Conference - Laurie

- reported that she survived the conference which was fantastic!
- guilds from all over Ontario contributed to the fashion show

Programmed Speaker - Claudette Hart of Gourds & Fibre, Merrickville, ON

- Claudette is a fibre artist who started weaving a couple of years ago
- uses dried gourds for the bases and weaving for the top sections of her pieces
- gourds are embellished with painting, wood burning, shells, metal, etc.
- talked about making musical instruments with gourds

Show and Tell

Anne Middleton showed a skein of 80% alpaca and 20% Polworth that she dyed and spun in a slubby style that she noted was not always easy for more experienced spinners because they tend to eliminate unevenness.

Bernadette Quade showed members a sample of ingeo corn fibre from Farmable Fibres.

Jean Sharp showed a felted rug she had made at a felted rug class with Carolyn and Tanya Webber at the OHS Seminar in Cornwall.

Kathleen Schwass showed her first attempt at overshot weaving using a pattern named Wandering Vine.

Judy Goforth showed her granddaughter's first spun and plied skein of yarn. She also showed some lace weight yarn that she had prepared with combed Shetland fleece which she'd also dyed.

Eleanor Murnaghan showed a sweater knit from Cascade 220 and also a sweater she's knitting for her daughter with Noro yarn.

Mandy Heggtveit showed a shawl she'd woven from silk with a 16 harness loom.

Elizabeth Watt explained Swing Knitting with a shawl she is knitting using this technique using her own fractal dyed yarn.

Marry Morrison showed her bound weaving sample named Colours of Autumn from the Weavers Unlimited show in Belleville, ON

Jan showed a sports car cat box intended to keep one's pet cat occupied while one is crafting

Hanna Jacobs showed a Lopi sweater she'd made for her move to Iceland to study for 11 months. She noted that it was her first colourwork project and first time steeking.
