President's Message

September marks the end of summer and the "beginning" of the year for many. And so it is with the guild's programming year which runs from September to June. An interesting program has been arranged so be sure to mark your calendar with all of the guild meetings.

Although there was lots of vacation R & R for most folks over the summer, guild activities continued. As I prepared to write this and share with you the variety of meetings that occurred over the summer, I realized it is not just me that attended all of these meetings but some members – not just executive members – also attended each and every one of these meetings. Thank you to those who gave up part of their summer to actively volunteer in the guild, whether a meeting, a demo, or what-have-you!

On July 9th and July 30th the Strategic Planning Working Group met. We are making progress on detailing goals for the plan. We have ten solid goals that will form a plan for the upcoming three, five and ten years of the OVWSG activities.

The Executive met on July 28th. We will meet next in late September. Consider that this is the last year for the majority of Executive members. Is an Executive position in your future? Think about it! Feel free to speak with any Executive member about their role.

An Operations meeting was held on August 13th. This group meets once or twice a year and includes volunteers in lead positions. For example, the Librarian attends but not the Assistant Librarians. For some positions there is only one 'lead', for example, the Yarn Convenor. At this meeting we receive an update regarding each position and work to resolve any challenges or needs to smooth out operations in that area. It is also an opportunity to look at budget needs for various positions

and allows the Executive to plan accordingly.

Also over the summer the Networking sessions continued and were well attended for the most part. As well, there were the Demonstrations which are always very busy in the summer and lots of fun if you volunteer to participate. Some of my most enjoyable guild activities have been volunteering for demonstrations.

Unfortunately, over the summer the Equipment Manager experienced sudden illness. Samantha is on the mend. Fortunately, the wonderful Equipment Manager Assistants, Carmen and Jackie, stepped up immediately and have been taking good care of the guild's equipment needs. Jackie will continue in the role of Equipment Manager until Samantha is ready to return. Many thanks to Carmen and Jackie! And kudos to Samantha for stepping back when necessary!

What a busy summer for the guild! I look forward to hearing about your summer at the extended Show and Tell at the September 14th meeting. All of these activities: yours, our guild's and mine, drive us into the Fall and another "new year".

"Open Studio"

It has come to the attention of the Executive that Open Studio has become rather confusing. I'm now in charge of the spinning and weaving sections of the Fair – which is why I'm writing this note. I very much want to have lots more entries in those two classes – and if possible, to have a display of interesting spinning wheels and spindles, other spinning tools, samples of fleeces and demos of how they're prepared, etc. It seems to me that members of the Guild would be a great source of all of the above, especially if given a long enough time to prepare entries (and to think about spending a few hours at the Fair, partly doing demos and partly just plain enjoying the events).

So here's the essential data: the 164th Middleville Fair will be held on Saturday, September 19th, with entries to be delivered to the Fairgrounds on the preceding Friday. 

June meeting minutes

General Membership Meeting 1 June 2015

7:30 pm, Heartwood House

ANNUAL GENERAL MEETING

(for year ending April 30, 2015)

Chair of Board: Mandy Heggtveit

Chair of Meeting: President Kelly MacGregor

• Chair welcomed all and **new members** and any **guests**.

Business:

• Introduce the executive.

- OHS Ruth gave a brief summary and slides of the OHS conference, *Panoply*, this year held at the Holiday Inn in Burlington. Guest speakers were Tom Knisely and Amy Tyler. OHS Spinning graduated 18 spinners this year from its course. The OHS conference will be held in 2017 at Seneca College in North York, and college residences will be available for accommodation. In 2016, Wassoon will hold its northern conference in Sudbury. (These conferences alternate with each other.)
- Raffle There are 2001 raffle tickets to sell this year.
- <u>Equipment</u> With equipment rentals, Say mentioned that a Google doc. A spreadsheet is being organized to coordinate them with the workshop instructors. There will also be sheets to indicate if there is any problem with equipment. Hopefully there will be a rental coordinator at some Network nights. There is a folder in the studio for smaller items, like bobbins, shuttles, etc., but table looms come with these, so shouldn't need these extra usually. The biggest issue is accountability, so important that rental form is filled out correctly, and only done with rental coordinators, Lise Horth-Susin, Linda Perrier, and June Prenger. There is new equipment and many have been assembled.
- <u>Workshops</u> An on-line registration system is also being set up for classes. On October 4, Norma Smayda, a Rhode Island weaver and historian, will present a 12-person workshop on Bertha Gray Hayes miniature Overshot Patterns and also talk at our General meeting. We will share the cost with Weavers Unlimited.
- <u>Security Kelly mentioned that guild will be tightening access procedures</u>, since the equipment is valuable and also to make procedures smoother. The access keys will be cut down to 10 holders of outside keys. Some will be shared and some will change owners. The studio, demo and equipment rooms' lockbox code will be changed.

President Kelly MacGregor

- Chair reminded members that only paid-up members may vote.
- Noted that Annual Reports all are on the front table, along with Nomination list for elections. (Reports will be stored in the Studio, along with past reports.)

Approval of Minutes from last year's May 2014 AGM.

'I move the minutes from last year's General Meeting be accepted as stands."

Motion: Ann Sunahara; Seconded: Carol Stewart. Motion Passed.

President's Report:

- Noted that Annual year runs from May 1st until April 30th.
- However, Funders, like City, fund on annual basis from January until December.
- Last year was a busy year. We celebrated our 65th Anniversary. Joining us for this event was one of the founding members, 93 year-old Dorothy Anstey.
- We initiated PayPal payments for membership on the website and as of today, we have 223 members.
- We have a dedicated rented classroom for workshops and one smaller room for the 100" loom, as well as the studio.
- There were 41 workshops, with 199 participants. 11 workshops were by-requests ones.
- Network sessions were held each Monday and monthly on Wednesdays as well, including over the summer.
- With growth comes more bureaucracy. The equipment manager took on 2 assistants, as well as positions became more clarified.

Financial Report:

- We were given \$8000 from the city. Our revenues exceeded last year, mainly due to increased workshops and memberships. We have \$8000 G.I.C's for emergency funds and a dedicated \$5000 reserve for equipment replacement and repair.
- With rent, telephone, cleaning, & other operations / month, we spend about \$2300 / month.
- We have registered for HST with Revenue Canada and April December 2014 financials were submitted to Revenue Canada. We will collect HST (13%) tonight for the auction.
- The financial statements will be reviewed in the summer by an internal audit.
- 'Move to accept the Financial Statements for 2014-15 as presented."

Motion: Terry Nelson; Seconded: Alison James. Motion Passed.

Elections:

Since 63 people signed in to the meeting for tonight, we have at least a 10% quorum, out of 223 members. [Bylaw 4.03]

Election carried out by Kelly MacGregor, Julie Zdunich and Mary Morrison.

15 minutes BREAK and TOUR if requested.

GENERAL MEETING AUCTION

Auction organized and run by Andrea Dixon. Around \$2000 earned from sold equipment from our inventory or donations.

Meeting adjourned at 9:45 pm.
