This Month's Program

Care of Textiles - with Sheilah Mackinnon and Ruth Cooper

This presentation will look at the main causes of damage, proper storage & materials, care, and display of textiles. It will include textiles in use (functional pieces) as well as historical non-use textiles (artifacts). Please bring your questions, as we will take them after our talk.

Upcoming workshops by Nancy Ingram

After the presentation on my workshops at the 20 March Guild meeting, we have made some adjustments, primarily to the **Traditional Tapestry Workshop**, to encourage more participation. Two more participants are required for it to go ahead. We have dropped the third day, scheduled for 30 April, and it will now be a two-day workshop, taking place on 22 and 23 April. This will lower the cost to \$150 for members and \$180 for non-members, and confine the workshop to one weekend. Also, as noted in my remarks on Monday evening, in response to questions, there is a fair amount of flexibility with regard to requirements; for example, you may use your loom of choice -- table type, rigid heddle, frame loom etc.-- as long as you can weave a plain weave or tabby; you may use 2ply or 3ply wool as the weft in 3 values of grey or a colour in 3 values; and you may use seine twine as warp or the 4/8 cotton. Participants are encouraged to register as soon as possible as there are notes that I will send out with regard to preparations for the workshop.

The **Needle Felting Easter Themed Workshop** is a "go" and there are still spaces available. This is a fun workshop where you will make Easter eggs, acorns, yellow baby chicks and an Easter bunny to enhance your Easter basket.

The **Transparent Tapestry Workshop** that takes place on 27 and 28 May is also a go although there are still some spaces available. At this workshop you will learn the inlay technique and design elements by sampling. I look forward to assisting you in designing your own tapestry using your new skills. I have left warping materials with Marie-France Gosselin who will share it with other participants. I have prepared information sheets for this workshop and the other workshops noted above and will forward them to participants who are registered.

Library

What is the Library:

The OVWSG has a large collection of books, magazines and DVDs on topics of interest to weavers, spinners, Felters, Basket makers, Dyers and other Fiber artists. The collection began with the magazine Loom Music from the 1940's and continues to acquire items that may be of interest to the membership. Magazines are kept in the white cabinets and the books and reference material are in the book shelves on the opposite wall. The topics within the collection are listed on the outside of the cabinets. There are lists of Author, title and subject on our website if you would like to know if we have a particular book or books on a particular topic.

We are trying to make the library easier to use by expanding the numbering we are using.

When:

The library will be **open the day of the meeting, usually by 9am**. I will post on the Facebook page as soon as I'm in so check the Ottawa Valley Weavers' and Spinners' Guild Facebook page <u>https://www.facebook.com/groups/OttawaValleyWeaversandSpinnersGuild/</u> to confirm it's open. **The library closes at 7:15pm** so that the librarians can pack up the library and not hold up the meeting by being late!

Where:

The library is in Heartwood House at 404 McArthur Ave in Ottawa, two blocks west of St. Laurent Blvd. We are on the main floor at the west side of the building. During the day of the meeting enter from the main doors at the front of the building and sign in at the front desk (you are going to the OVWSG studio), walk past the elevator, through a door and turn right, down a hallway. We are the last door on the right. I am usually there, working on the computer.

Who can use the library:

You must be a member in good standing to take out library materials. This means that if you have overdue items or have not yet renewed your membership, you can't take out books. If possible, please renew your membership online before the meeting; that would be helpful to the librarians!

How to check out a book:

There is a library card in the back of all library material. **Please print clearly to make your librarians' lives easier!** To fill out the card you will need to enter:

Date = date of the next meeting (May 2017 or 05-2017)

Name= Your full first name, last name and phone number (Miaka Scott-Martin,_613-111-2222) you can use a second line if you need to. Give the completed card to the Librarian with the sign "Outgoing Books". This is usually Alison; she will stamp your reminder slip which has all the info to contact us if you can't make it to the next meeting.

How to return books:

To return a book Look for the sign "Incoming Books"; this is usually Terry. Tell the librarian your first name and they will pull your cards from the file box. If your books are overdue, the fine is \$1.50 per item per month late. There is usually candy available at the book return!

If you are in the studio on non-meeting days, please put your returning books into the book return box by the double doors and then email the library to let us know you have dropped off your books.

NEW: We have acquired a few more back issues of Wild Fiber magazine so please come check them out! As always if you have any questions you can always ask the librarians!



- Executive was introduced with thanks for all their support and that of our committees and volunteers. The executive is now tracking their volunteer hours so that there will be a sense of the workload required of these positions.
- A tour of the guild spaces was offered to take place during the break.

*Reminder to all members to please bring indoor shoes during messy weather as we borrow our meeting space from the Unitarian Fellowship.

Business & Announcements:

- **Workshops:** There is space in most workshops from now onward. Sign up for those workshops you're interested in upcoming months to guarantee your spot! There is space in a few April courses:
 - Introduction to Acid Dyes (April 2): students will create 72 samples and have a full sampler to take home.
 - Fabulous Felted Flowers (April 5) a Wednesday night!
 - Instructor Nancy Ingram gave a preview of her tapestry and felting workshops for this year.
 - Easter (Apr) and Christmas (Dec) Felted Ornament workshops will teach people how to make shapes and forms, add colours and appendages.
 - Traditional Tapestry (Apr) will provide instruction on shapes, joins, colours, and designing your own project. For Traditional Tapestry be prepared to use whatever loom you bring to class. This class may be modified back to two days of instruction – the price will be adjusted accordingly.
 - Transparent Tapestry (May) will instruct in the ways of inlays, symmetry, asymmetry, elements of design and technique.
 - Needle Felted Flower Design Tapestry (Nov) will be a 'painterly' design felting session on blacks prepared by Nancy.

Tablet/Phone: Apps for weaving; Weave It, Stitch Sketch etc. Take photos of the underside of your weaving (rather than use a mirror). Household items: Trim from Home Depot = lease sticks!; Tyvek envelope (Staples)= label things you're dyeing; venetian blinds= warp sticks; Toilet paper tube/Christmas wrap tube= nostepinne (wind a center-pull ball), also good to use with a rigid heddle warp where the knots are tied on; ribbon= measuring tape; IKEA bag clips = clip the warp theads while threading the loom; drinking straws= bobbin replacements; spatula with slots or holes in it = warping paddle; collapsible wagon to transport your loom or wheel.

Laurie Harkin-Chiasson

Handmade bobbin stand of board and small dowels=organize your bobbins for multi-colour wefts; paintbrush/shaving brush= clean your loom mechanisms; cone tubes= saves one to weigh out the difference to determine how much yardage is left on a partial cone (Not guaranteed, assume it's heavier); M&M candy tubes= needle storage (warp thread repairs); warping board pegs= add elastics at the tip to prevent threads from slipping off; spacer= separating warp threads to make repairs; old shoelaces for tying back things on the loom – also two sided Velcro is great; thread

cutters/scissors to hang around your neck;Turnaround markers for tapestry= thread a fine sewing thread through the same heddle as your warp thread; Colour wheel (Walmart art section); bodkins are useful for getting the most length out of a warp in the shrinking shed space; cardboard pieces to establish standard sizing of things like fringes, bookmarks etc; tiny retracting tape measures; dedicated log book to track your work; Shuttle spacer= put a nut or two onto the shuttle post to use the extra bobbin space (prevents it from catching); magnetic board to track pattern with magnet when weaving; temple = hold your weaving flat while working on it.

Mandy Heggtveit

Ikea clips are handy when tying a new warp onto a dummy warp; paper clips to hold the heddles back (Ikea has some nice thin flat ones) just clip them onto the bars that suspend the heddles; butcher twine (waxes tips) and use for lease sticks.

App: Color Wheel; salad spinner for speeding up the drying process; starburst Tupperware lid for felting.

Terry Nelson

Fb weaving hack: beaded counter to track treadles and long repeats.

Carlene Paquette

Velcro dot on spinning wheel to stick fibre to when stopping temporarily.

Karin Hendriksen

Permanent press: roll scarfs with a layer of cloth onto a metal bar and suspend over a pot of steaming water for 1-1.5hrs. Don't roll it too tight, and secure with a string. When you take it off it should be wrinkle free – with exception to where a fringe is.
