Stay Camp!

We are going to pilot a special Studio session this summer that we are calling "Stay Camp". I'm still figuring out details and I expect it will evolve as we see who wants to come, but it will be a "Choose Your Own Adventure" style with the following basic outline:

Stay Camp will run from Friday, July 7 to Monday July 17. The Studio will be open with a "Camp Counsellor" from 9:30 to 4:30 each day. Campers can sign up for all or any days during that time at no charge. Four floor looms have been set aside for Stay Camp, which campers can sign up for up to 5 days, the idea being that this is an intensive work period. Campers who are interested in similar things might decide to warp one of the looms together and share it to each make a project on that warp over the intense period. The other floor looms will still be available for longer-term users. Other Studio equipment will be available and we will have a sign up arrangement for that as well.

Some of the rental equipment may be available – this will depend on summer rentals and workshops.

Campers will plan their own projects and be responsible for their own materials. Campers should come with a good basic knowledge of the craft they are planning to work in, but are encouraged to ask for advice as needed. Campers should also be willing to provide that advice to others as much as possible while still getting to work on their own projects.

Jan has offered to provide "Story Time" on some of the days, meaning there will be opportunities to look at the library and take out books. I'm suggesting we also have potluck "Snack Time". We may decide to have some theme days such as a dye day. That way we will know if mentors will be available and we can arrange the limited space safely.

The usual rules for library and equipment use will apply. Equipment can be used by members in the Studio at no charge, but must arrange a rental if they want to take it home. Library materials can be viewed in the Studio, but must be signed out (with summer deposit) if leaving the building.

Please consider volunteering as an assistant Camp Counsellor for some of the days, as I don't think I can quite manage all 11 days. Counsellors will have a set of keys and be responsible for opening up the Studio, fetching equipment from the Equipment room or classroom and ensuring it goes back at the end of the day, supervising the signup lists for the floor looms and other equipment, and making sure the room is tidy at the end of each day.

Campers might also be able to come in the evening; we would have to see how we would arrange for keys etc. Perhaps someone would like to offer to be an "Evening Counsellor".

Please let me know your thoughts and if you are interested. This came about when several of us realized that we could not go on planned fibre vacations for a variety of reasons, but wanted to spend some concentrated time socializing while exploring our crafts in a somewhat structured way.

This spring I am offering 2 Rib Basket Classes. I find this technique is very forgiving for beginners and also very adaptable with regards to making purely functional baskets, or decorated art objects.

I have decided to have both classes, Apr. 30 and May 6th, be "multilevel" Rib Basket Classes, to attempt to cooperate with my students' schedules and obligations. Both weeks' class will include a gathering expedition to a near by wetlands to gather materials. Students do not have to take part in this, and can arrive at 10.30 a.m. instead. Gathering starts at 9.00.

Then beginners will make a smallish rib basket, with or without a handle, and those with some experience can try a flat-back basket to hang on the wall, or a tray or a 4 section base basket using Rib Basket technique. Of course, students could attend both classes. Let's hope the path will be drier than it is right now. Rubber boots are definitely in order!



Program: Care of Textiles by Ruth Cooper and Sheilah MacKinnon

- An overview of basic fibre structures, causes of damage and deterioration of textiles and proper storage, mounting and cleaning of textiles. Include proper materials to use and examples.
- Ruth Cooper has a Masters in Art Conservation and worked in conservation for Parks Canada and the Museum of Civilization.
- She provided us with a colourful and detailed slide presentation on the history of some ancient textiles, basic fibre properties, main causes of damage and deterioration, proper care and storage, as well as supplies and materials to help with care and storage.
- Sheilah MacKinnon has a Masters in Art Conservation and works at the National Gallery of Canada. She provided us with a listing of some supplies and suppliers to go with the samples she has brought in. Sheilah demonstrates many storage and preservation methods on a variety of textiles.
