Dear fellow guild members,

Spring is in the air and with that more fibre fairs and shows. When this gets to you, Embro, (near London, ON) will have had their 11th Annual Fibre Arts Competition at the Alpaca Ontario Spring Show on March 30th. Every Saturday in April, MERA (MacDonald's Corners) School House Weavers are having their Weavers Exhibit and Sale. Northumberland Hooks and Needles Guild are hosting "The Gathering", a Yarn and Fibre Fest, at Port Hope's High School, for local fibre artists 'on April 14.

Along with all these exciting fests and fairs, individual eastern guilds are planning their own activities and workshops. Several guilds in various regions have Regional seminars in the spring or fall and get to meet members from other guilds and share skills. It is an event that I would like to see start up again. It used to be done in this area, prior to St. Distaff's Day. Anne Middleton - In Memoriam

Anne Middleton passed away on Saturday, January 27, 2018. She will be sadly missed, as she was a very active and influential member of the Guild. Anne started spinning around 1997 and started weaving in 2004. In a relatively short time, she became a very accomplished spinner of fine yarns; her trademark knitted lace shawls are exceptional. Anne was very instrumental in getting our first Resource Center established at our Chapel Street location in 2003. With her grand vision and determination, Anne pushed and prodded to set it in motion. Many Guild members were involved once the movement started, but Anne was the spark that set things moving.

Anne was President of the Guild from 2002-2006 and she brought a special tone to the job. She once wrote in the newsletter,

"I am thankful to so many of you who...have expressed support for my somewhat relaxed style."

She would end her President's Messages in the newsletters with "Happy Spinning, Weaving or Whatever, Anne."

Anne was also editor of the newsletter, Program Coordinator for a year and the coordinator for the Ex and Sale several times running – becoming a vendor in the last decade. She mentored many young beginning spinners and was quite generous with her help and time. Anne enjoyed collaborating



with her Guild colleagues to produce finished works, not only on the 100" loom, but also through discreet collaborations using her incredible handspun yarns. She loved handwoven clothing, which she wore with genuine pleasure; Anne was a tireless ambassador for our Guild.

It is a very substantial legacy to leave behind and we wish to acknowledge her wonderful generosity, kindness and contribution. We have a large hole in our Guild "fabric", with Anne's passing.

Workshops

As I posted on Facebook in mid-March, there is now a new online workshop registration process in place, thanks to Web Magician Judy Kavanagh. From now on registering for workshops will go like this:

- 1. Find your way to the specific workshop listing, either from the category lists under the workshop tab, or from the calendar. The listing will tell you about the workshop.
- 2. At the bottom of the listing you will find a form where you fill in your name, email address and phone number. Please check for typos, more than one registration attempt has been foiled in the past when I couldn't reach the student because the email address had an error in it.
- 3. Select the number and type of spot you want (e.g. if you are a member but want to register your non-member friend at the same time choose quantity "1" of each). If you are registering more than one person put the other person's name and email in the notes. If you are registering as a surprise gift for someone please put their name and email in the notes and indicate when it will be safe to contact them directly.
- 4. Select your payment method. Then find and click the "Register" button at the very bottom under the "Notes" box.
- 5. If you chose PayPal, the system will take you straight there to pay with credit card, or through your PayPal account if you have one. If you choose offline you will get an email with my mailing address and an instruction to print the email and send it with your cheque. NOTE: If you choose "offline" and the class fills with people paying online before I receive and **manually** confirm your payment in the system you will lose your spot.
- 6. Once payment is confirmed (immediately for PayPal; and whenever I receive and manually enter "confirmed" for cheques) you will receive an email confirming your registration and giving you details about location, entering the building, parking and lunch etc. If this email does not appear when it should (immediately for PayPal, within 2 weeks after you mail a cheque for offline) something is wrong, so please contact me. Likewise, if you chose "offline" and don't get the instruction email something is wrong and you need to contact me. Do also check your "Spam" or "Junk Mail" folder.
- 7. If the workshop is full you will see a link to "get on the waiting list". This form is similar to the old registration form. Once you submit it comes straight to me and I will check the list whenever a cancellation is made in a full workshop.

This new system is a LOT more efficient for me and should be easier for everyone. Please give us your feedback as you use it. We will tweak things if we can. I am very grateful to Judy Kavanagh for researching and implementing the system for us.

As always, there are a lot of workshops still available to choose from. Go look at the calendar or the listings and then join in!

Library

The library will be open usually by 9am on the Monday of the meeting. I will always post on Facebook as soon as I am in.

The library closes at 7:15pm to allow the librarians to put away the library materials and attend the meeting.

Anyone with a membership in good standing and having no overdue library material may take out up to 4 items from the library which will be due back the next meeting.

To take out a book you will need to fill in the library card with the date due (next month's meeting) and the name of the borrower being your First and Last name plus your phone number.

If you are unable to make the meeting contact the librarians and we may be able to renew your items for a month, providing another member has not requested them. Library late fines are \$1.50 per item per month.

Please take good care of the library items you borrow so that we can enjoy them for many years.

If you are in at the studio and wish to watch one of the videos that are on the white cabinet shelves please use the VLC program to view the videos. If there are people in weaving there are 2 kinds of headphones so you can enjoy the video without distracting the weavers.

Update on the library migration

As the older members might remember, our library started out with the purchase of Loom music Magazine and the donation and bequeathment of some of our earliest books. For many years, the library was brought to meetings in a box, then that changed to more boxes. Eventually, books were requested and brought in. By the time I joined, we used a sometimes-damp closet under the stairs at a school. I spent my time in the closet while the meetings happened in a progressively colder gymnasium. But from then on we had a slowly expanding library that moved with us.

Originally all weaving books were cataloged as 746.14 (Dewey Decimal) as we expanded earlier librarians struggled with the limited number by adding more decimal points for different topics. This became problematic even before I started working with the library.

When I took over, we already needed to readjust the numbers for better usage. But with only one librarian, it was impossible to do the kind of restructuring that would help to keep the library running at the same time. We finally have a wonderful team of librarians, which is making this long overdue move possible.

We have made the first pass through the catalogue and found a few spots where it would be helpful to adjust the new numbering. We will be able to do a much better assessment of the content of the collection as we work on the second pass through the collection. The last part will be re-labeling and expanding the Reference section. We will be moving some of the irreplaceable or more delicate items into Reference. They will still be accessible, but just not in the regular circulating part of the library.

To decide on the framework that would be appropriate to our collection, we looked at the topics we have or we thought appropriate for our library. What we are using is a reasonably simple and logical progression. The first part is administration (law and business/ studio and guild) then think about the

process of sheep to shawl. Source of fiber to fiber prep, to dyeing, felting or spinning to yarn to design to weaving to making the finished garment.

So our basic structure is:

100's Law and business

200's Studio and Guild

300's Fiber sources / Fiber prep

400's Colour and Dyeing

500's Felt

600's spinning and yarn

700's Fine art /Textiles /Design /Weaving

800's Sewing (secondary to Weaving)

We are still considering dropping the textile books to 900's to give weaving number space and it makes sense to have the textiles after the weaving and sewing.

We hope that we will have this finished in the near future, but hope you will be patient while we try to make the library more accessible to you. We will publish a full list of the entire collection as soon as we are done. In the meantime, the 2016 listing is still available online but the number locations will be incorrect. Please use the temporary labels to find the topics you are looking for and the above list will help point you in the right direction.

We are presently working in the 700's section so are getting much closer to completion!

Classes


